Meerkat Class



Becky, Class Teacher says...



This term has been a great start to the school year!

In Meerkat class, the learners have embraced their new classroom, adults and peers.

We have seen confidence grow in communication and social interactions, as well as trying new ways of working and learning!

This term, our topic is 'toys' and we have had a lot of fun exploring teddies, dolls, vehicles, television characters, Toy Story, construction, robots and soldiers! Our class have had the opportunity to have regular sessions in the sensory play bus, mud garden, music with Anita, karate with Alan, and interactive storytelling with Katie the Traveling Librarian. We have also begun our swimming sessions, where the learners have been building confidence in the water, practicing their kicking and independence skills of getting undressed and dressed.

In 'thinking and learning', we have been exploring number, shape, measurement and real-life contexts. The children have all worked hard exploring one-to-one correspondence, addition and using a part whole model as well as identifying different types of shapes. They have used their understanding of number to measure objects looking at the length and height as well comparing and identifying what they see. We have explored money, identifying different coins, placing these in order and using these within role play to buy snacks in the Meerkat tuck shop!

In 'independence and life skills', we have been using language-focused play, promoting initiating and communicating with our peers and adults. The children and adults have enjoyed playing drama games such as 'the Zoo keeper and the monkey', focusing on skills such as turn taking, making eye contact and having fun with their peers. We have also enjoyed cooking lessons, making our own toast and sandwiches, as well as pizza and cakes linked to the different weekly themes. This has helped to focus on our cutting skills and safety when using different equipment when cooking!

We are looking forward to one more week on robots and soldiers, and then finishing off this term with our elf workshop linking to 'toys' - and of course Christmas!
