It has been so lovely seeing our learners in their school uniforms. I wanted to take this opportunity to thank you for your hard work in making this happen. Please can I remind you that school uniform is now compulsory for all learners in all years, apart from those in Years 12, 13 and 14. Please speak to your class teacher if you are having difficulties supporting your child with wearing uniform and we will work out a plan to support them. We will re-send the information about our uniform suppliers for your information.

**Thank you for your patience with the car park.** It is always different in September because the bus routes are new and everyone has to learn the routines - it will calm down!

#### Just to remind everyone of the timings:

- Buses will unload at 9.10am and parent drop-off is at 9.20am, although we will start collecting
  learners as soon as the bus learners are safely inside school.
  - Parents need to park on the gate side of the pedestrian crossing (outside the school hall).
- Any bays nearer the Muga are for buses initially, and can then be used for parents after the buses
  leave.
  - In the afternoon, the buses leave at 2.45pm and parent pick-up is 2.55pm.

In the morning, the SLG and car park staff will leave the car park as soon as the learners are safely inside, usually about 9.25am. Any learners arriving after this point will need to go through the school office. We want all our learners to be in as quickly as they can, so that learning can start. For this week, we have been a bit more relaxed as we know that some of our learners need time to get into the school routine.

Going forward, the School and the Friends of Edith Borthwick (FOEBS) have decided to have **a school mascot in the form of an elephant (to go with our animal theme).** The elephant will be called Edie, short for Edith (Borthwick)! More information will follow about how we will use our mascot around school.
